1. This year teachers have had 4 action steps that they've been accomplishing. First is positively teaching and reinforcing classroom rules and procedures. Second is displaying, modeling, and reinforcing the pride matrix with a different monthly focus, facilitated by the PBIS committee. Third is that the admin team will utilize walk-through forms to evaluate teachers' use of PRIDE as their classroom rules and or expectations. The fourth is the one that staff is struggling with. This step is that staff will emphasize speedy student travel during class changes by monitoring spaces outside their classrooms. Unfortunately the tardy issue is a huge problem, and many ideas were tossed back and forth to rectify this problem. November had 2219 tardies from 741 students, December had 2086 tardies from 766 students, and January had 1838 tardies from 704 students.
